






You and Your Chapter Needs Assessment

It's that time of the year again – time to complete your **Chapter Needs Assessment (CNA)**.

Here are some helpful hints for completing your report.

1. Consider having each member complete the Member Needs Assessment found in the Membership Development Manual on page 68. * This will provide you a wealth of information regarding your chapter, as well as providing you information for your CNA.
2. The Chapter Membership Chairman (CMC) and the Chapter President should work together to complete the CNA. If this is the first year of the biennium, the Immediate Past Chapter Membership Chairman and Chapter President should help with this.
3. **Download/copy** a CNA from the website for your work copy at your convenience.
4. When it is completed, the CMC may complete the report ***online during the month of August***. When submitted online, it will automatically go to the Regional Membership Consultant.

Eta Chapter has been holding a plant sale annually for almost 20 years. Eta Chapter members take orders for a variety of flats, pots and hanging baskets from friends, family, coworkers and many others. Pratt's Nursery in Toughkenamon, PA provides the plants at wholesale cost.

The profits from the sale go the chapter delegate fund, which is used each summer to offset the costs of our members who attend the International Convention or Regional Conference.

Our typical profit from the sale is anywhere from \$1800 - \$2000 each year. This always covers registration costs and usually some of the other expenses incurred by our members. Having these funds available has enabled Eta Chapter to have representatives at every convention and conference for many years.
